The Strafford County Family Justice Center can help survivors navigate available services, break the cycle of violence and develop healthy relationships.

Who can the Family Justice Center help? Victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking (we call them survivors) can find compassionate, comprehensive services at the Family Justice Center.

What is the Family Justice Center and what can I get there? The Family-Justice Center is a place where survivors will find many of the services they need under one roof. Working together, we provide coordinated, comprehensive services. Survivors can talk to a confidential advocate, plan for their safety, interview with a police officer, meet with a representative from NH Legal Assistance, speak with a prosecutor, receive information on shelter, and get help with additional available resources all under one roof.

Services available at the Center (other services available on an on-call basis):

A SAFE PLACE: A Safe Place provides crisis services to survivors of domestic violence, dating violence and/or stalking, their families and the community through a 24-hour hotline, safety planning, court accompaniment and social service advocacy, support groups and education.

SEXUAL ASSAULT SUPPORT SERVICES (SASS): SASS provides confidential advocacy and support to survivors of sexual assault and their families through a 24-hour hotline, at police stations, hospital emergency rooms, child advocacy centers and court. SASS facilitates support groups and provides community and school-based prevention education.

NH LEGAL ASSISTANCE: NHLA provides counsel and advice to low-income clients of the SCFJC in the areas of domestic violence restraining orders and family law related matters.

LAW ENFORCEMENT: Law Enforcement provides security at the SCFJC and, when requested by clients, takes reports and provides appropriate follow up as needed and in consultation with the relevant Police Department, such as photographs and video interviews of adult victims.
